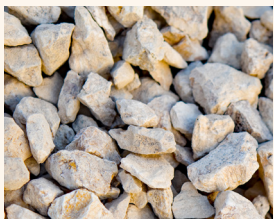
We have bulk materials available 1/2yd. (13.5cu.ft) or 1yd. (27cu.ft.).

We carry soil amendments, Bark products, and rock in bulk.

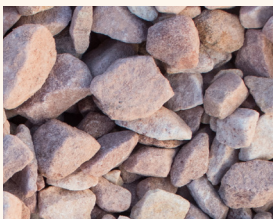

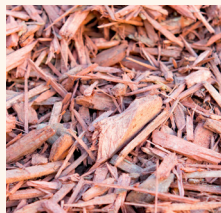

BULK MATERIALS

Bulk Materials are Available for Pickup and Delivery with 5 Yard Minimum Local

TOPSOIL: Clean, sandy loam, used for building up soil level.

COMPOST: Composted blend of organic matter, used to amend poor soils.

HALF & HALF: half topsoil, half compost, used for filling planters and raised beds.

70/30 MIX: 70% topsoil, 30% compost, used for sod prep when rototilling is not possible.

PLANTING MIX: Our blend of topsoil, compost, wood shavings, used in raised beds, containers and landscape.

NURSERY BLEND: Special planter mix with 7 lbs. fertilizer mixed in.

KELLOG'S CERTIFIED ORGANIC SEED TOPPER: Fine screened and ground organic compost for covering lawn seed and general landscape/garden.

FOREST MULCH: Forest mulch is a recycled wood product great for slopes, hills, and any landscape area.

GORILLA HAIR/SHREDDED MULCH: Gorilla hair ideal for planted for areas as a finished top dressing also used as insect and weed control, hold moisture & insulates roots.

SUNSET RED MULCH: Sunset red mulch is a dyed nontoxic reddish color bark perfect for accenting any garden/planted area.

CHOCOLATE CHIP MULCH: Chocolate chip mulch is a dyed nontoxic brownish color bark perfect for accenting any garden/planted area.

SUPREME WALK ON BARK: Walk on bark is ideal for use in planted areas, its shredded texture holds moisture and insulates roots

MEDIUM DECORATIVE BARK: Medium decorative bark with its natural reddish brown color is a premium bark to enhance any garden/planted area.

To determine square footage, multiply length x width. Example: 10 x 10 = 100 square feet. Decide how many inches you want to add and look in the left hand column for depth. Find the closest to your square footage. This will tell you how many yards to order.

Water New Marathon Sod-(Dry Regions)

Water sod lightly after each 200 square feet is installed, to prevent wilting. After all the sod is down and rolled, turn on your sprinklers and let them run until sod is good and soaked. To keep it that way, for the first week, water until runoff begins, once every three hours at 7AM, 11AM and 2PM. During the second week water twice a day at 7AM and 2PM. During the third week water at 7AM. Eventually taper back to once every day.

Adjust according to weather and season – water more frequently during warm or windy weather. After your lawn has become established (approximately 6 to 8 weeks), water according to the following guidelines:

- As infrequently as possible (once or twice a week in the cooler months, three or more times per week in warmer months), to maintain a healthy green condition.
- For as long as possible to get deep soil penetration (10 to 15 minutes). It may be necessary to cycle irrigate if runoff occurs after a short time. Water until runoff occurs, and then stop and wait for the water to penetrate (about an hour) then repeat.
- Water as early as possible between 7AM and 10 AM.
- DO NOT water areas in the shade as frequently as areas of lawn that receive full sun.

In addition, be sure to watch for blue-gray tint and limp areas of your lawn. This is not Fungus. It is caused by dehydration and is an indication that immediate watering is needed. This usually occurs on tops of mounds and where sprinkler coverage is not adequate.

(It is acceptable to water grass in the full sun; it will not burn the blades)



Lawn Renovation Checklist

Before Sod Arrives:



❑ Kill old lawn. For best results, first water and fertilize your lawn so that it is in a vigorous growth mode. Then spray entire lawn with Roundup®, carefully following directions on the packaging. Roundup is a highly effective herbicide that enters the plant through its foliage and is translocated all the way down to its root system. One thorough treatment will usually completely kill your old lawn and weeds.

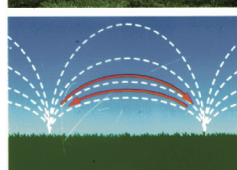
❑ Remove dead lawn. Using a sod cutter, strip away dead turf. Roll or section dead turf and discard. (Sod cutters can usually be found at a local rental yard or nursery.)

❑ Rototill soil and install or repair sprinklers. Only after removing rocks or debris, rototill soil to a depth of 4" - 6". Consult local nurseryman for soil amendment and irrigation system recommendations.

❑ Rake and fine grade. Rake to break up large clods and remove any remaining debris. Fine grade by scraping across the surface to smooth uneven areas. Finished grade should be 1/2" below walkways, driveways, and/or patios. Please Note: Sod is uniformly machine-cut and will conform to any irregularities left in the grade.

❑ Apply Marathon Sod & Seed Starter™. Distribute the Marathon fertilizer evenly over prepared area, either by hand, or by using a "whirlybird" style applicator. Avoid applying under windy conditions. For best results, follow directions on bag.

❑ Roll soil. Roll soil to settle and firm the surface. Fine grade again, if necessary. (Rollers are available from a local nursery or rental yard.) Soil should be dry to avoid compaction.



After Sod Arrives:

❑ Lay sod immediately upon delivery. Begin laying sod adjacent to the longest boundary of the area to be covered. Stagger each new row of sod so that seams are offset, as in a brick wall. Butt ends and edges tightly together.

❑ Conform to curved surfaces. Cut sod with heavy knife to conform to curved boundaries, planters, etc. After first 200 square feet are installed, water sod lightly to prevent wilting.

❑ Roll sod. When all the sod is installed, use a roller to ensure a good contact between the sod and native soil.

❑ Water thoroughly. To avoid having dry patches in your lawn and to promote even growth, sprinkler system pattern should provide "head-to-head" coverage as indicated by arrows.

❑ Watering New Marathon Sod. Water Sod lightly after each 200 square feet are installed, to prevent wilting. After all the sod is down and rolled, turn on your sprinklers and let them run until the sod is good and soaked. To keep it that way, for the first week water until runoff begins once every few hours at 7 am, 11 am and 2 pm. During the second week water twice a day at 7 am and 2 pm. During the third week water at 7 am. Eventually taper back to once every two or three days. Adjust according to weather and season – water more frequently during warm or windy weather. After your lawn has become established (approximately 6 to 8 weeks), water according to the following guidelines:

• As infrequently as possible (once or twice a week in the cooler months, three or more times per week in the warmer months).

• For as long as possible to get deep soil penetration (up to 30 minutes). It may be necessary to cycle irrigate if runoff occurs after just a short time – water until runoff occurs, then stop and wait for the water to penetrate (usually 1 to 2 hours), then repeat.

• As early as possible – first thing in the morning.

❑ Mowing. Mowing should begin one week after installation.

Tips on Planting Native

Step 1

Prepare garden beds for your native plants in fall. Select sunny places in your yard and mark off beds by pounding a wooden, plastic or metal stake at each corner and then tying string to form a rectangle. Make beds at least 2 feet wide by 4 or 6 feet long. Pull all weeds and unwanted plants from the bed area.

Step 2

Spread a 2- to 3-inch layer of any type of organic compost and other organic materials, such as peat moss, on top of the soil in your bed areas. Turn it under to a depth of 8 to 12 inches and then water the area with a sprinkler for 20 minutes or longer.

Step 3

Broadcast seeds of many native species in fall. Follow seed packet instructions for correct planting depths, distances apart and other particulars regarding each type of seed. Water well for 15 to 20 minutes.

Step 4

Dig planting holes for bedding plants that are large enough to accommodate the roots of each plant. Leave sufficient space between plants, based on their mature size. Then, set the native bedding plants into their planting holes and cover them with the soil/compost mixture. Water well for 15 to 20 minutes.

Step 5

Spread a 2- to 3-inch layer of compost or other organic material on the ground around your plants to serve as a mulch to help keep the soil warm and moist and keep weeds away.

Step 6

Control snails and slugs by scattering iron phosphate granules or diatomaceous earth on the soil around your new plants and sprouting seeds. If aphids or other insects attack your plants, spray them with insecticidal soap every other day until all signs of the insects are gone.

January:

Prune Trees & Shrubs
Start spring seeds indoors for transplanting in late Feb. early Mar.
Lawns- Fertilize and mow @ 2" during cooler months.
Apply dormant spray on deciduous trees

February:

Continue planting Roses and Trees.
Start planting Shrubs & Natives.
Lawn: Mow regularly @ 2" water according to weather. Overseed at this time.
Citrus & Avocados- In warmer inland areas feed now. Deciduous Fruit Trees feed now.
Ornamental Grasses- Cut Back
Prune- Evergreens (junipers, pines etc.)
Woody Overgrown Perennials - Cut back now.
Fertilize-Roses and Perennials, consider using a systemic product to keep insects from invading spring blooms.
MULCH- 2" to 3" layer of Cedar Mulch or Bark Chips will prevent weeds and help retain soil moisture.

March:

Continue planting Container grown Trees, Shrubs, Perennials/Annuals, Natives and Groundcovers.
Plant Vegetables-tomato peppers squash etc.
Apply Preemergents to flower beds and groundcovers to stifle weeds. Try Amaze.
Start Container Gardens
Divide Perennials: Daylily, Flax, Grasses
Fertilize-Lawn and Mow @ 2" Over seed now.
Fertilize- Roses and Perennials water well
Fertilize-Citrus and Fruit trees in Coastal areas at this time.
PRUNE: Camellias after bloom has finished.
Pinch tips on fuchsias to promote bushiness.
SNAILS: Eggs are hatching time to bait try Sluggo or That's It.

April:

Continue planting Trees, Shrubs, Perennials, Roses Annuals & Vegetables.
This is time to start corn, cucumbers, melons and beans.
LAWN: Warm Season Grasses (St. Augustine & Bermuda) should be de thatched and fertilized.
Fescue and Ryegrass should be let grow to 3" to prepare for summer Temps also fertilize.
Fertilize- Roses Citrus Fuchsias and perennials
Dead-Head Flowers to promote more blooms.
If conditions are dry watch for Spider Mites.
SNAILS- Continue bait for Snails during this active period.

May:

Continue planting warm season Natives Annuals, Vegetables and Perennials.
Lawn: Fertilize and Mow regularly to keep it thick and healthy.
Fescue should be mowed @ 3" in warm weather.
Prune- Winter flowering trees and shrubs once they are finished blooming.
Watering: Keep up on it with approaching warm days.
Keep an eye out for yellowing leaves or pale leaves with green ribs. This is a sign of IRON Deficiency apply an Iron product such as Ironite or Liquinox Iron Zinc.
MULCH: If you haven't yet you should NOW.
2 to 3 inches of Cedar Mulch over planters and groundcovers can keep weeds down the soil moist longer and also keeps the soil cooler so plant roots thrive.

June:

Plant Heat Loving Tropical's and Palms and warm season Annuals/Perennials.
Drought tolerant and Native plants need only deep infrequent watering now through fall. Every 10- 14 days.
Continue Dead-Heading flowers to promote more blooms and for a tidier look.
Cut back overgrown Perennials to promote another round of blooms and clean up messy looking areas.
Lawn: Water Regularly (Temps above 90 degrees daily)
Mow @ 3". Rake once a month Fertilize every 6 weeks.
Avoid fertilizing during Warmer spells.
MULCH: Your plants are crying for it.
2" to 3" layer of mulch can protect the roots of your plants.

July:

As the weather gets warmer Garden in the early morning or late afternoon both you and the plants will appreciate it.
Plant Pumpkins now for Halloween harvest.
Continue Dead-Heading Flowers if not daily at least once a week.
When perennials and annuals get scraggly cut back 1/3 or more to rejuvenate for Fall.
Keep new plantings well watered.
Fertilize Acid Loving plants Such as Azaleas, Gardenias, Camellias and Blueberries.
Fertilize Container Plants and Vegetables.
LAWN: Mow & Water Regularly Light Fertilizer if Temps are below 85 degrees

August:

Watering is most IMPORTANT CHORE this month. Remember Watering Basics:
1. Water Early in the morning (between 7AM and 10AM).
2. Water the Soil Not the leaves - Best to use bubblers in planters and beds.
3. Water infrequently and deeply not shallow and often.
Check Irrigation for any repairs to be made.
Containers- Soak Well if they still look wilted move them to a shadier area until cooler temperatures arrive.
LAWN: Mow and water regularly. If above 85 degrees no fertilizer.
Fertilize- Roses, Citrus, Acid Loving Plants and Fruit Trees now.
Watch for Iron Deficiency and feed with Iron product if needed.

October:

As the days grow shorter and temps cool reduce the frequency of watering but don't reduce length of time system runs.

Time to plant Trees, Shrubs, Perennials and Groundcovers again. Continue planting cool season annuals. Cooler Temps help plants establish for next season.

Prune trees and shrubs for winter. Shaping and removing dead or dying wood. Cut Back Geraniums.

Lawn: Think about overseeding all lawns at this time. For fescue and ryegrass use like seed. Bermuda and St

Augustine use annual winter Rye seed.

Fertilize and lower the mower height to 2" for cooler months on Fescue and Ryegrasses

December:

Poinsettias are ready! Happy Holidays... Roses- Withhold water this month and stop fertilizing to harden them off for winter. In warmer areas they may need a drink or two. Now is the time to move roses from one place to another.

Pruning- If plants are damaged by frost resist the urge to prune. The damage may protect the rest of the plant from further frost.

Prune Fruit Trees if you haven't already done so. Seal all larger cuts and spray with a Dormant

SPRAY.

Time for a second application for those of you who have sprayed once already. Cut back dormant Grapevines. Wisteria should have all the thin shoots from last season Cut back leaving two or three buds at the base

September:

Start planting fall annuals (pansies calendula, snapdragons, cyclamen, stock, primrose, alyssum) and Mums.

Keep up watering September is still warm and the Santa Ana winds are near. If you know the winds are going to blow Soak well before they arrive, hydrated plants withstand wind better than dry plants.

Fertilize: Roses Acid Loving Plants and containerized plants. Lawn Mow @ 3" and water regularly.

Prepare areas to be planted this fall or winter with fresh organic soil amendments.

November:

Adjust watering schedule according to weather. Water less frequent but for as long as normal. Most Trees and Shrubs only need water once a week during the cooler months. Citrus and Avocados only once a month if there has been no rain. Begin planting Trees shrubs groundcovers and perennials if you haven't already. Divide Perennials and Cut back Ornamental Grasses.

Lawn: Mow @ 2" fertilize and water regularly. Snails and Slugs: Lay their eggs at this time so fighting them now is essential to having fewer snails in the spring when eggs hatch. Try Sluggo.

Prune deciduous fruit trees and shade trees and seal all larger cuts. Spray with Dormant Spray or Neem Oil to prevent disease and Insects.

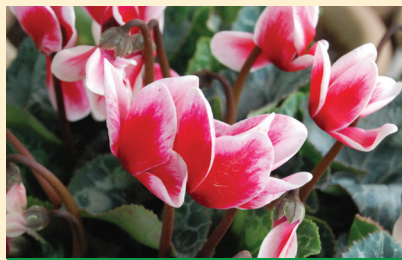

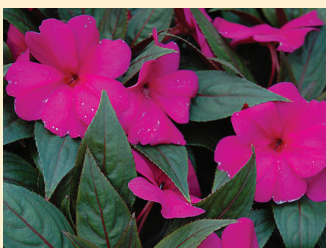

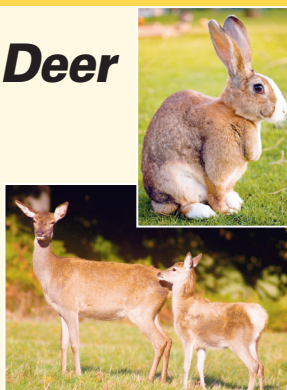

Mix 3.5 tablespoons per gallon

For Transplants : use 1 to 8 pts of diluted solution per plant, depending on size. For example, use 1 pint of mixture on mums, geraniums and other annual flowers. For roses buses, azaleas, gardenias, camellias , and other shrubs, use 3 pints per plant. For plants larger than 4 ft, (trees and large shrubs) use 1 gallon or more of the mixture per plant. Pour diluted solution over the soil as the roots are being covered, making sure that the are wet with the solution, wet soil around the plant with water after transplanting.
